This second rallye can stand proudly on its own, offering an extraordinary sequence of destinations—**Berlin's** living history, **Prague's** fairytale skyline, **Vienna's** imperial grace, **Budapest's** Danube panorama, **Zagreb's** old-world charm, and the sun-kissed Adriatic shores that lead you from **Poreč to Split** and **Dubrovnik**, where ancient walls watch over turquoise waters. From there, the adventure crosses the sea as you board a ferry to **Italy**, arriving refreshed for the final stage of your journey into timeless **Rome**. But the **THIRD RALLY EUROPE** is also designed with flexibility in mind. If you dream of turning your experience into a grand trans-European expedition, you can easily combine the **FIRST** and **THIRD RALLIES**. Although the two itineraries do not meet seamlessly by road, the connection is simple: After finishing the **FIRST RALLYE** in Marseille, you can take a quick flight to **Frankfurt**, where the **THIRD RALLY** begins. Your rental car, accommodations, and logistics are arranged upon arrival, ensuring a smooth transition between both adventures. With this option, the Rally Europe experience transforms into a panoramic sweep across Western, Central, and Southern Europe—an unforgettable journey made of two perfectly coordinated chapters.

Just like all **RALLY EUROPE** programs, the **THIRD RALLY** is also fully customizable. You may start at any point along the itinerary, join only the segment that inspires you most, or extend your trip into other regions. Whether you begin in **Frankfurt, Berlin, Vienna, Budapest, Zagreb, Split, Dubrovnik**—or even **Rome**—your departure city becomes the first page of your own story.

DAY 1 (Friday) INTERNATIONAL FLIGHT

Arrival at Frankfurt International Airport and reception through your local guide who will help you with the paperwork to get your rented vehicle. Then drive to the hotel. Here begins our journey across Europe towards the hotel in the city of Frankfurt (14km, 17m). In the afternoon, we will visit the center of Frankfurt, including the Römer Square and the center of the old city where the town hall (Rathaus) is, with its typical architecture. We will walk down the Zeil Street where you can find exclusive shops like Hollister or department stores. Finally, we'll go for a walk along the River Main ... Unforgettable! Get together and dinner at the Hotel and first briefing planning our next days. (D)

DAY 2 (Saturday) FRANKFURT - ERFURT

Breakfast at the hotel. We drive in north direction to the city of Erfurt (261km, 2h 41m), the capital of the state of Thuringia and well known as Martin Luther was a monk in the Augustinian monastery in town. Explore the city. Located just 50 km to the southeast of the geographical center of Germany, is the country's most central metropolis. We suggest you visit two of the many churches in the city, the cathedral and the church of San Severino. Overnight at the hotel. (B)

DAY 3 (Sunday) ERFURT – BERLIN

Departure after breakfast to the capital of Germany (302km, 3h 17m). Once at the hotel, check-in at the selected hotel and in the afternoon guided walking tour through the main attractions of the city and a symbol of reunification: Brandenburg Gate, Postdamerplatz, Alexanderplatz, Kurfürstendamm ... and the remains of the wall that divided the city until 1989. At dusk we recommend you visit the Sony Center and enjoy German cuisine. Enjoy also some drinks there. You can also assist to the Berlin Philharmonic with best classical concerts. Overnight. (B)

DAY 4 (Monday) BERLIN

Breakfast at the hotel. Visit of the Charlottenburg Castle, where you can see the grandeur of the Imperial Germany during the XVI and XVII centuries. In the afternoon drive to Sachsenhausen to visit the Museum of the concentration camp of World War II showing the development of the Holocaust. If you prefer to stay in the city, you can go to the Museums Island. Overnight. (B)

DAY 5 (Tuesday) BERLIN – POTSDAM - BERLIN

After breakfast, drive to the city of Potsdam (35km, 37m) where we will visit the famous castle and the Neues Palais Sanssouci (New Palace). Spend as much time as you can, walk in the park and see from outside the outstanding buildings. Anytime in the afternoon, return to Berlin. Free time for shopping at the Kurfürstendamm, also known as Kudam. Overnight. (B)

DAY 6 (Wednesday) BERLIN - DRESDEN - PRAGUE

Breakfast and departure for Dresden, the former capital of Saxony, along the River Elbe, which was largely destroyed during bombing in World War II (193km, 2h 6m). Visit of the center of this beautiful imperial city, its castle, its narrow streets around the cathedral and the Semper Opera. Continue to the Czech Republic to reach Prague (150km, 1h 49m). Dinner and overnight. (B) (D)

DAY 7 (Thursday) PRAGUE

Breakfast at the hotel. Morning guided city tour visiting the Castle, St. Vitus Cathedral, the picturesque Lower Town "Mala Strana", Victory Church of the Infant, Jesus of Prague, Charles Bridge, Old Town Square and Astronomical Clock. Free afternoon. Our suggestion: drive to Karlstein and visit the castle, a beautiful area and location. Overnight. (B)

DAY 8 (Friday) PRAGUE - VIENNA

Breakfast. Morning departure to the city of Vienna (331km, 3h 26m), Central European city on the banks of the Danube, in the valley of the Vienna woods, at the foothills of the Alps. The historic center of the capital of Austria was declared World Heritage by UNESCO, noting first that its architectural and urban qualities represent an outstanding testimony of a continuous exchange of values throughout the second millennium. Since the sixteenth century Vienna has been universally recognized as the "musical capital of Europe." Upon arrival at the hotel, accommodation. Übernachtung in Vienna. (B)

DAY 9 (Saturday) VIENNA

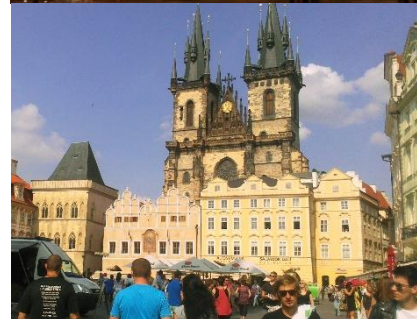
Breakfast at the hotel. Morning guided city tour in Vienna, visiting the Belvedere Palace, the Opera House, Royal Palace, City Hall, Votive Church, Danube Canal, with the iconic Prater Ferris Wheel, etc.. Afternoon free for optional excursions: Imperial Palaces or Grinzing, town famous for its wine taverns and green. Accommodation. (B)

DAY 10 (Sunday) VIENNA - BUDAPEST

After breakfast, drive to Budapest, capital of Hungary (244km, 2h 16m). Budapest hosted the Hungarian royalty in various occupations in the Middle Ages, the Renaissance, the modern and contemporary era until 1944 when the monarchy disappeared in Hungary. After arrival in the city, check into the hotel. Accommodation. (B)

DAY 11 (Monday) BUDAPEST

Breakfast. Sightseeing tour of the city that is divided into two areas, "Buda" where the old city is located and "Pest" modern and commercial area. We begin with the Buda castle hill to watch the vast Danube and the Pest extension. We walk around the old quarter to learn about the origins of the city through Matthias Cathedral, symbol of the most glorious days of Hungary, Fishermen's Bastion, etc. Then, suddenly, you will start navigating the Danube with your bus. Unique tour that will fascinate you. Back to the hotel for private activities or just drive around and along the River Danube. Dinner and overnight in Budapest. (B) (D)





DAY 12 (Tuesday) BUDAPEST - ZAGREB

Breakfast. The tour continues through Hungary towards Croatia. Our next destination is the city of Zagreb, the Croatian capital and the country's largest center (346km, 3h 28m). Check-in at the Hotel. In the afternoon, visit the historic old town with its main attractions. Accommodation. **(B)**

DAY 13 (Wednesday) ZAGREB - POREC

Breakfast at the hotel. Departure to the beautiful town of Porec Adriatic seaside, where you can relax after the busy days (248km, 3h 12m). Situated on the western coast of Istria County in Croatia, Porec offers in his 37 km of coastline endless possibilities for relaxation and water sports. Visit the historical center and enjoy the sea and the beach. Overnight. **(B)**

DAY 14 (Thursday) POREC - SPLIT

Breakfast at the hotel. Today the rally continues south along the beautiful Adriatic coastline of Croatia. The route from Poreč to Split (470 km, approx. 5h 10m) is one of the most scenic drives in Europe, following the curves of the coastline and revealing an ever-changing landscape of islands, cliffs, coves, and small Mediterranean villages. On arrival in Split, check-in at your hotel. In the afternoon, explore the historic center, dominated by the impressive Diocletian's Palace, which has been continuously inhabited for more than 1,700 years. Walk along the Riva promenade, enjoy a refreshing drink by the sea, or get lost in the narrow marble streets filled with cafés and artisan shops. Overnight in Split. **(B)**

DAY 15 (Friday) SPLIT - DUBROVNIK

Breakfast and departure south towards Dubrovnik (230 km, approx. 3h 10m), following once again one of the most stunning coastal highways in the world. The road winds between mountains and sea, offering spectacular views at every turn. Upon arrival, check-in at your hotel. In the afternoon, visit the historic walled city of Dubrovnik, known as the "Pearl of the Adriatic." Walk along the massive stone walls, admire the views of the terracotta rooftops and the deep-blue Adriatic, and explore landmarks like the Rector's Palace, Sponza Palace, the Cathedral, and the Stradun. At sunset, we recommend taking the cable car for a panoramic view of the city. Overnight. **(B)**

DAY 16 (Saturday) DUBROVNIK

Breakfast at the hotel. Free time to relax from the previous day, to enjoy the facilities of the hotel and to spend a nice time at the beach. Overnight in Dubrovnik. **(B)**

DAY 17 (Sunday) DUBROVNIK – FERRY TO ITALY

Breakfast at the hotel. Enjoy a relaxed morning in Dubrovnik with time for a final stroll along its medieval streets or a coffee overlooking the harbour. In the afternoon, drive to the ferry terminal for your overnight crossing to Italy. Procedures for boarding your vehicle will be assisted by our team. Once on board, settle into your cabin and enjoy the maritime journey across the Adriatic Sea. Night on board. **(B)**

DAY 18 (Monday) ARRIVAL IN ITALY - ROME

Breakfast on board. Upon arrival at the Italian port (Ancona or Bari depending on ferry schedule), disembark and begin your drive towards Rome. The route passes through the Italian countryside, transitioning from coastal landscapes to rolling hills, vineyards, and ancient towns on your way to the Eternal City. Drive time will depend on the port of arrival (approx. 3–4h from Ancona; 4–5h from Bari). Arrive in Rome and check-in at your hotel. The afternoon is free for a first encounter with the city—perhaps a walk to the Trevi Fountain, Piazza Navona, or the Spanish Steps. Overnight. **(B)**

DAY 19 (Tuesday) ROME

Breakfast at the hotel. Morning guided tour of the Imperial City, visiting the Roman Forum, Colosseum, Arch of Constantine, Piazza Venezia and the famous Trevi Fountain. In the afternoon, you will visit St. Peter's Square in the city-state of the Vatican, the Basilica of St. Peter and the Vatican museums and the famous work of Michelangelo, the Sistine Chapel. Overnight. **(B)**

DAY 20 (Wednesday) ROME

Breakfast. Day at leisure. We suggest visiting the Catacombs of St. Callixtus on the outskirts of Rome or to take a trip to Naples, a city near the Vesuvius volcano that buried the city of Pompeii in 79 AD, or visit Capri Island that captivated the Roman Emperors because of its natural beauty. Farewell dinner **(B) (D)**

DAY 21 (Thursday) ROME – AIRPORT

Breakfast. Right on time we will take you to the Rome airport for your flight back home or next destination in Europe. Return your rented car, take the time to do it. End of our services. **(B)**
