Learn where the word Black Market came from, where Ebeneezer Scrooge is buried (yes, really) and how Edinburgh University worked closely with the serial killers Burke & Hare. Edinburgh's history is long and fascinating, made even more special when told by our enthusiastic and passionate guides. Our tour includes a visit to Edinburgh's Underground Vaults, one of the most hidden and historic places in all of Edinburgh. Your guide will tell you about our Underground's dark history and some of the strangest things that happen down there as well as some famous historic characters connected to our specific vaults. The afternoon is yours to explore local museums, shops, or traditional pubs. Overnight. (B)

DAY 3 EDINBURGH Experience the beauty of Scottish Highlands

Breakfast at the hotel. Our today's trip takes you through some of Scotland's most spectacular landscapes. Departing from Edinburgh, we head northwest past the imposing Stirling Castle, stopping for light refreshments in the Callander area as we enter the Highlands. We continue through Rob Roy Country, over the wild beauty of Rannoch Moor and Black Mount, arriving at Glencoe, one of Scotland's most hauntingly beautiful glens and the site of the 1692 MacDonald massacre. Here, we pause for a photo and to absorb the atmosphere. Travelling via Loch Linnhe, we stop in Fort William for lunch, then pass beneath Ben Nevis, Britain's highest mountain, as we follow the Great Glen. After passing through Fort Augustus, we arrive at Urquhart Castle on the shores of Loch Ness—where you may enjoy an optional cruise and castle visit. If not, we go to the Clansman Hotel, where you'll enjoy free time. You can relax with an optional gin tasting by Great Glen Gins (with a 10% shop discount), explore nearby walks like the Old Coffin Road, or take a one-hour cruise on Loch Ness with views of the castle (optional). Loch Ness is, of course, famed for sightings of the legendary "Nessie". Our return journey winds through the Cairngorms National Park and Perthshire's woodlands, with a refreshment stop in the Victorian resort town of Pitlochry before arriving back in Edinburgh. Overnight. (B)

DAY 4 EDINBURGH Discover Fascinating Scottish History

Breakfast at the hotel. Your morning begins with a visit to one of the most iconic landmarks in all of Scotland: Edinburgh Castle, dramatically perched atop Castle Rock with panoramic views across the city and beyond. With your entrance ticket, you'll explore this historic fortress at your own pace, discovering centuries of history behind its stone walls. Wander through the Crown Jewels Room, where Scotland's crown, sceptre, and the legendary Stone of Destiny are kept. Step into the Great Hall, walk the ancient battlements, and feel the weight of history in St. Margaret's Chapel, the oldest surviving building in Edinburgh. Whether you're interested in royal history, military heritage, or simply the breathtaking views from the castle's elevated perch, this visit is an unforgettable window into Scotland's dramatic past. In the afternoon, immerse yourself in the rich tradition of Scottish whisky with a curated visit to Johnnie Walker Princes Street, Edinburgh's premier whisky experience located in a beautifully restored landmark building on the city's most famous thoroughfare. More than just a tasting, this is a multi-sensory journey through the story of Scotland's most famous whisky brand. Begin with a guided experience tailored to your flavour profile, created using state-of-the-art technology that matches your palate with the right whisky styles. Along the way, you'll explore vibrant rooms inspired by whisky regions of Scotland, with immersive visuals, storytelling, and interactive elements that bring the world of whisky to life. The tour concludes with a guided tasting of premium whiskies, chosen to match your personal preferences. Whether you're a curious beginner or a seasoned enthusiast, you'll come away with a deeper understanding—and appreciation—of the art, science, and soul of Scotch whisky. For a perfect finale, you may choose to enjoy a cocktail or dram in the stunning rooftop Explorer's Bothy Bar, offering panoramic views over the Edinburgh skyline. (B)

DAY 5 EDINBURGH - DUBLIN

After breakfast at the hotel, enjoy a leisurely morning to soak up Edinburgh's atmosphere. At the given time, you'll transfer to the airport for a short flight to Dublin. Upon arrival in Dublin, settle into your centrally located hotel. The evening is yours to sample the capital's famed nightlife—perhaps a cosy pub with live traditional music or one of its excellent modern bistros. DAY 6 DUBLIN

Stroll through the elegant Georgian squares with their colourful doors, explore Dublin Castle's courtyards, and visit the impressive St. Patrick's Cathedral. In the afternoon, perhaps enjoy a tour and tasting at the Guinness Storehouse, culminating in a pint with panoramic city views (not included, please let us know your interest to include it on the program). The rest of the day is at leisure to shop along Grafton Street, relax in St. Stephen's Green, or discover Dublin's literary and musical heritage. Overnight at the hotel. (B)

DAY 7 DUBLIN Day trip Giant's Causeway and Titanic Experience

Breakfast at the hotel. Start your day heading north. Your first stop is the dramatic Dunluce Castle, perched on cliffs above the sea. Built in 1513, these photogenic ruins are among the most striking in Ireland—perfect for a short stop and memorable photos. Next, you'll visit the world-famous Giant's Causeway, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of Ireland's most unique natural wonders. Enjoy about 90 minutes to explore its 40,000 hexagonal basalt columns, formed by volcanic activity over 50 million years ago. Legends tell of the Irish giant Finn McCool, who built the causeway to reach Scotland—myth and science intertwine here in unforgettable fashion. Afterward, we'll visit the enchanting Dark Hedges—a 300-year-old beech-lined road made famous by Game of Thrones as the King's Road. It's one of the most photographed natural spots in Northern Ireland and a must for any photography lover. Your journey continues to Belfast, where you'll visit the award-winning Titanic Belfast museum. Spread across nine interactive galleries, this state-of-the-art attraction brings the story of the Titanic to life through immersive exhibits, special effects, and full-scale reconstructions. Explore the shipyard, descend into the ocean's depths, and discover the legend of the Titanic in the very city where it was built. Following the museum, enjoy free time in Belfast city centre, with its vibrant atmosphere, modern shops, and lively Cathedral Quarter before the return drive to Dublin. (B)

DAY 8 DUBLIN Galway, the Burren and Cliff Moher

Breakfast at the hotel. Departure by bus early in the morning. Our first stop will be the Cliffs of Moher. There's much to explore here, so we give you plenty of time to take in the might and majesty this place has to offer. And maybe take a few photos too! To keep your strength up on The Cliffs of Moher from our Dublin day tour, we'll stop off for lunch at Doolin Village. This is really a great place to sample the local culinary culture, and you'll find plenty of great food options. We continue to the Burren, a truly unique location — think spectacular limestone pavements and unique rock formations that can't be found elsewhere. Then, we continue to the Bohemian city of Galway. Of course, the pubs are great, but there's plenty to enjoy outside. The rest of the afternoon is free to explore the city at your own pace—browse local shops, listen to street musicians, or enjoy a seafood dinner by the bay. (B) (L)

DAY 9 DUBLIN Excursion into Southern Ireland

After a restful night in Galway, the day begins with breakfast at the hotel before you join a full-day journey into the soulful landscapes of Ireland's south-west. Leaving Galway behind, the coach winds along stretches of the Wild Atlantic Way, where the morning light washes over rolling fields, stone walls, and shimmering coastline. Gradually, the scenery grows grander, rising into the mountains and lake-filled valleys that define Killarney National Park. You pause in the welcoming town of Killarney, where brightly painted shopfronts and lively cafés. In the afternoon, the road leads eastward through the pastoral charm of County Cork and the soft meadows of County Tipperary. Villages appear like postcards—stone churches, cosy pubs, and quiet streets where everyday life flows unhurriedly. The changing landscapes reveal the gentle, rural heart of the country, offering a serene contrast to the Atlantic cliffs and rugged mountains earlier in the day. Continue your journey back to Dublin. (B)
