On this tour you will see the city's main landmarks, including Wall Street, Rockefeller Center, UN Headquarters, 5th Avenue and Times Square. Most important for the whole family is the city tour with the aim of recognizing famous movie scenarios. Even the hotel we're staying in was the backdrop for movies like Wall Street, Quiz Show, Presumed Innocent, Malcolm X, The French Connection, Happened in Manhattan with Jennifer Lopez, the Man on a Shelf and Men in Black 3. In addition, we will experience a "Cruise of the Lights of the Port", with stunning views of the city that never sleeps. After New York, we will visit the city of Philadelphia, where American independence was signed. Our Philadelphia hotel is located next to the largest shopping center in the east of the United States: shopping opportunity in paradise!. Then we'll head for Washington DC. Of course, we'll also visit the city's landmarks, Lincoln Memorial, Jefferson Monument, Arlington National Cemetery and others.

DAY 1 Friday INTERNATIONAL FLIGHT TO NEW YORK

Flight to New York City. Upon arrival, reception through our partner in the USA and transfer to your hotel. Room distribution. In the afternoon, around 16:00 we will go on a shopping tour and visit the Empire State Building before sunset ([Sleepless in New York with Tom Hanks and Meg Ryan](#)) for a beautiful sunset in the city that never sleeps (at least up to the beginning of the Pandemic). Dinner on your own before returning to the chosen hotel. Accommodation at the [Roosevelt Hotel](#).

DAY 2 Saturday NEW YORK

Breakfast at the hotel. Today we will discover the world metropolis on a bus tour as well as on a walking tour. The visit includes: United Nations Building, Trump Tower, St. John the Divine Cathedral, Central Park, Dolkota House, Battery Park, Wall Street, Ground Zero, Rockefeller Centre, Fifth Avenue, St. Patrick's Cathedral to end around 1:00 p.m. During your free time you can go to one of the New York Pizzerias and then explore fifth avenue, shop or visit the Museum of Modern Art. Our guide will help you in everything you need. Return to the hotel. Around 5:00 pm exit to Times Square in order to explore this part of the city and see the active life of New York. Transfer to the port for our "Port Lights Cruise". For two hours, you'll enjoy the magnificent view of New York City with live commentary. On board the boat you will be able to buy some snacks and drinks, as well as souvenirs. During the cruise, we will see the Statue of Liberty (among other films, [King Kong](#)), the symbol of New York. Brief stop to take pictures. The statue, work of Frédéric Auguste Bartholdi, a French sculptor dedicated on October 28, 1886, was a gift to the United States from the people of France. It is a female figure in robe depicting Libertas, the Roman goddess of freedom, who carries a torch and a tablet that evokes the law, on which the date of the Declaration of American Independence, July 4, 1776 is inscribed. A broken chain is at her feet. The statue is an icon of freedom and the United States: a welcome sign to immigrants arriving from abroad. The cruise will end at 9:30 p.m. and we'll be back at the hotel later. Accommodation at the [Roosevelt Hotel](#). (B)

DAY 3 Sunday NEW YORK

Breakfast at the hotel. In the morning we will head to Lower Manhattan, first visiting Ground Zero, the former land of the World Trade Center, which was destroyed on September 11, 2001. The afternoon is free for private activities. We suggest that, for example, you see the Zoological Garden ([Madagascar](#), [cartoons](#)) or just enjoy walking around the main commercial area.

We also suggest that you do some cultural activities, such as visiting the Museum of Natural History, one of the most beautiful museums in New York ([Nights in the Museum with Ben Stiller](#)). The American Museum of Natural History located on Manhattan's Upper West Side is one of the largest and most celebrated museums in the world. The museum complex consists of 27 interconnected buildings that house 45 permanent exhibition halls, as well as a planetarium and library.

DAY 4 Monday NEW YORK - PHILADELPHIA

Breakfast at the hotel. Today we are traveling to Philadelphia (Rocky with **Silvester Stallone**), the largest metropolitan city in the U.S. and the largest city in the state of Pennsylvania. Philadelphia was the nation's original capital and is known for its art and culture. Steak with cheese and soft pretzel are emblematic of Philadelphia cuisine, which is shaped by the city's ethnic mix. After arrival, we will take you to a local restaurant to taste this reference point of Philadelphia cuisine. After that, we will start a tour of the city by visiting its most important touristic sites, including the Liberty Bell and independence hall in Independence National Park. The famous Liberty Bell is a sign of the American independence and spirit. Independence Hall is the place where both the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution of the United States were debated, written and ratified by the Founding Fathers of the United States. Afterwards, we will continue to King of Prussia, a small county next to Philadelphia to check into our hotel. This city is very popular for shopping and has the largest shopping center in the east U.S. Rest of the day off for private activities. (**Hampton Hill Hotel, Fairfield Inn, Crowne Plaza**) **(B)**

DAY 5 Tuesday PHILADELPHIA - WASHINGTON

Breakfast at the hotel. Today we continue to Washington DC, formally the District of Columbia, also known as D.C. or Washington and is the capital of the United States of America. Founded after the American Revolution as the seat of the government of the new independent country, Washington was named after George Washington, the first president of the United States and the founding father. It is the seat of the U.S. federal government, Congress, and the Supreme Court of Justice. The city, located on the banks of the Potomac River, bordering Maryland and Virginia, is one of the most visited cities in the United States, with more than 20 million visitors a year. It is also home to many national monuments and museums, which are located mainly in or around the National Mall. Arrival at the hotel and room layout. Rest of the day off. You can relax at the hotel's spa or swim in the outdoor pool. Or you can leave the hotel to explore the city on your own. (**Courtyard Dupont Circle by Marriott Hotel**) **(B)**

DAY 6 Wednesday WASHINGTON National Mall

Breakfast at the hotel. This morning's tour features many of Washington DC's most famous attractions. We'll start the tour with the National Mall. First **you'll see the Franklin Delano Roosevelt Memorial**, built in honor of President Roosevelt's four terms with statues and murals depicting themes from the Great Depression to World War II. We will move forward to see the **Korean War Veterans Memorial** dedicated in 1995 to the 42nd anniversary of the armistice that ended the conflict. The monument consists of 19 statues of soldiers representing a patrol squadron, drawn from each branch of the Armed Forces. Next will be the **Thomas Jefferson Memorial** which stands as a symbol of freedom and was designed as a smaller version of the Roman Pantheon with marble steps and monumental Ionian columns; inside he holds a bronze statue of Jefferson and the walls are embedded with excerpts from his letters, speeches and the Declaration of Independence. Next is the **Vietnam Veterans Memorial** honoring members of the U.S. military who fought and died in service or were included on the Missing in action list during the Vietnam War. Then we'll look at the **Martin Luther King Jr Monument**, which pays homage to the famous American pastor, activist, humanitarian and best-known leader in the civil rights movement: Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.



After this, we will see the **National Memorial of World War II**, which honors the spirit and sacrifice of the 16 million men and women who served abroad and the more than 400,000 who perished, and which has been open to the public since 2004. The monument built to celebrate the heroes of the Greatest Generation remains one of the most visited sites in the National Mall. We continue to the **Washington Monument**. A monumental obelisk was built to honor George Washington, the 1st president of the United States, and stands today as the tallest independent stone structure in the world. Construction began in 1848, but lack of funds, political disputes and the Civil War interrupted the work from 1854 to 1877. Finally, we will see the **Lincoln Monument**, which is located at the western end of the National Mall as a neoclassical monument to the 16th President of the United States. A 19-foot statue of Abraham Lincoln sits overlooking the reflective pool and Washington Monument. Small stop in between for lunch (not included). The tour continues through the **White House**, home to all presidents of the United States except George Washington. The White House site at the Pennsylvania Avenue was selected in June 1791. The design of the Presidential Mansion (as originally called) was decided by a contest, and the winner was James Hoban, a native of Ireland. Our next visit is at the **U.S. Capitol**, the seat of Congress and the legislative branch of the U.S. federal government. It is located on Capitol Hill, at the eastern end of the National Mall. We will finish the visit at the **Arlington Cemetery** where the U.S. Marine Corps War Memorial (Iwo Jima Memorial), a national monument dedicated in 1954 to all Marines who have given their lives in defense of the United States since 1775, stands out. Back to the hotel. Rest of the day off for private activities. **(B)**

DAY 7 Thursday WASHINGTON [Smithsonian Institution](#)

Breakfast at the hotel. Today we're leaving all day to visit the Smithsonian Institute and its museums. The Institute is one of the largest art collections in the world with several themed buildings. As you can choose what to visit, our guide will help you in the decision. The Smithsonian Institution's 19 museums have free admission and range from modern art to native American cultures. It's impossible to visit them all in a day, not even in a week. The most popular are the National Museum of Natural History, the National Air and Space Museum, and the National Museum of American History. If you want a lighter day, you can shop in the city or just walk around the mall and its surroundings. In the evening, our guidewill invite us to a farewell dinner **(B) (D)**

DAY 8 Friday WASHINGTON

Breakfast at the hotel. You'll have the day off until departure to the airport for your connecting flight or your flight back home. After a busy week, with a lot of knowledge and entertainment, we will finish this tour with incredibly good memories of this famous American cultural triangle. If you are planning an extension of your vacation in the USA, we will be happy to organize it for you. Please, let us know your expectations and plans. End of our services. **(B)**
