DAY 02 CAIRO Pyramids - ASWAN

Breakfast at the hotel. This morning a private A/C vehicle will transport you to Giza, the home of the world's most iconic sights Sakkara, stopping to see the step Pyramid, which heralded the beginning of the pyramid age, before arriving at the Great Pyramids of Giza, one of the seven wonders of the ancient world. Next station will be the Great Sphinx, the oldest monumental sculpture in the world. After the visits, we will continue to the train station and get onboard the sleeping train travelling to Aswan (B) (D)

DAY 03 ASWAN

We will have our breakfast on board of the train, as we arrive in Aswan. We'll visit the Temple of Isis on the Island of Philae, see the Unfinished Obelisk, set within the bedrock from which it was once carved, and after that we explore the High Dam that has given life to the Nile Valley for decades. After the visit, we will embark in our 5 stars Nile cruise and have lunch on board. After lunch we sail on board of a traditional felucca, crossing the Nile to see the Botanical Gardens on Kitchener's Island. Dinner on board of our cruise, overnight in Aswan. (B) (L) (D)

DAY 04 ASWAN - KOM OMBO - EDFU

After breakfast onboard we will Visit Kom Ombo Temple which is shared by the Two Gods Sobek & Haroeies. Afterwards we will have lunch on board. Rest of the afternoon free to enjoy the ship's facilities. While sailing on to Edfu, you can enjoy the afternoon tea on the upper deck and also see the sunset on the Nile River. We will have our dinner on board and after dinner enjoy an oriental show and Balabeya party. Overnight in Edfu onboard

Breakfast onboard of the cruise. After breakfast, we will visit the temple of Horus in Edfu, then we will have lunch on board while we continue sailing to Luxor via Esna, a lock that regulates the waters of the Nile. Crossing the lock is interesting since it is a scenic photo spot for the Nile travelers while crossing on board their Nile cruises onto Edfu coming from Luxor or onto Luxor from Edfu departing from Aswan. Upon arrival, we will visit Luxor & Karnak Temples, which is a serious of temples built in different reigns. Starting by the Avenue of Sphinxes visit the Unfinished Propylon, the Hypostyle Hall with its 134 gigantic columns, the Obelisks of Queen Hatshepsut and Tutomosis III, the temple of Amon adorned with lotus and papyrus designs, the Granite Scarbeus of Amenophis III and the Sacred Lake. Back to the ship, we will have our dinner on board and afterwards we will enjoy the belly dance show. Overnight in Luxor. (B) (L) (D)

After having breakfast on board, we will check-out and leave our floating hotel. Continue with an A/C vehicle to visit the West Bank crossing the Nile. Drive to the Valley of Kings, where we will visit the tombs of various Dynasties, the Temple of Deir El Bahari. On the return journey stop at the Colossi of Memnon which are two gigantic sitting statues representing Amenopis III facing the Nile. After that visit, we will continue to the Temple of Queen Hatshepsut, the fifth pharaoh of the Eighteenth Dynasty of Egypt. She was the second historically confirmed female pharaoh, after Sobekneferu. The Temple of Hatshepsut is located opposite the city of Luxor and considered to be a masterpiece of ancient architecture. After our visits we will go to the train station to ride back to Cairo on the sleeping train. Overnight onboard the train. (B) (L) (D)

We will have our breakfast on board of the train. After breakfast, our journey continues with a visit to one of the most important museums in the ancient world, the Egyptian Museum that houses more than 100,000 relics of Egypt. After the visit, we continue further in the city where you will discover the Citadel of Saladin, Mosque of Mohamed Ali, the Hanging Church and the world-famous Kahn El Khalili bazaar. Then back to hotel and overnight in Cairo. (B)
