DAY 1 INTERNATIONAL FLIGHT – BUDAPEST

Intercontinental flight to Budapest. Arrival at the international airport. Reception through our partner in Hungary and drive with a private vehicle to the hotel. Rest of the day at leisure for private activities. Budapest, home to the famous Liszt Academy and a vibrant classical scene, also offers optional evening concerts that we can book for you. Overnight at the selected hotel.

DAY 2 BUDAPEST City tour

After breakfast we will visit Budapest, capital of Hungary that hosted Hungarian royalty in various occupations in the Middle Ages, the Renaissance, the modern and contemporary era until 1944 when the monarchy disappeared in Hungary. The city is divided into two areas, "Buda" where you will find the old city and "Pest" modern and commercial area. We start with the hill of Buda Castle to see the vast Danube and the extension of Pest, the old town, the Cathedral of Matthias, the Fisherman's Bastion and others. We will continue the tour with a beautiful bus tour on the Danube River. Yes, you read that correctly. This unique Budapest tour explores the city by land and water without the need to change vehicles! RiverRide is a 1-hour, 40-minute sightseeing tour which it will show you Budapest's sights from the comfortable seat of a bus, first through its busy streets and then from the Danube waters, the iconic Budapest River, and one of the world's most famous rivers. You will never forget the magic of admiring the views of the elegant city as the small waves sway you. When we return to the mainland, we will go to a local restaurant for lunch and then return to the hotel for a rest. For tonight, you may also choose to attend a performance at the renowned Hungarian State Opera—reservations available upon request. **(B)**

DAY 3 VIENNA City Tour and Schonbrunn Palais

Breakfast at the hotel. Transfer to Vienna en private transport. Upon arrival visit city tour of this central European city on the banks of the Danube and in the foothills of the Alps. Its historic center was declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO. Since the 16th century Vienna has been universally recognized as the "musical capital of Europe". Today we will take a walking tour of the city seeing its highlights, among others, Stephansdom Cathedral, the historic center with the Hofburg and the Ring of the City marveling at its architecture and important buildings such as the Opera House. Later on, we head to the monarchy's summer residence, Schonbrunn. In possession of the Habsburgs from 1569 until the end of the monarchy in 1918, the palace of Schonbrunn is one of the most beautiful Baroque buildings in Europe. The palace has a total of 1441 rooms, of which 45 can be visited. The Hall of Mirrors saw the young Mozart perform in 1762 when he was only six years old. Back to the hotel.

Highlight additions: Vienna is also home to the Musikverein, one of the world's most perfect concert halls, and the Konzerthaus, both offering nightly orchestral performances that we can book for you. The opera house was inaugurated as the "Vienna Court Opera" (Wiener Hofoper) in the presence of Emperor Franz Joseph I and Empress Elisabeth of Austria. It became known by its current name after the establishment of the First Austrian Republic in 1921. Vienna offers a wide variety of classical concerts and operas—early booking is highly recommended. Overnight. (B)

DAY 4 VIENNA – SALZBURG (296km 2h 49m)

Breakfast at the hotel. Today we leave Vienna towards Salzburg, the fourth-largest city in Austria and one of its biggest attractions. Located at the shores of the River Salzbach, Salzburg's historic centre is renowned for its Baroque architecture and is one of the best-preserved city centres north of the Alps. The historic center was enlisted as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1996. Salzburg was the birthplace of the 18th-century composer Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart and that's one of the reasons why most of the visitors come to the city. We will make a walking guided tour visiting its iconic monuments like the Mirabell Palace, the Cathedral, the Mozarts Birth House and follow the route of the musical tour. Afterwards, you will have time at leisure for private activities, like visiting the Hohensalzburg Fortress, which is enthroned on the Festungsberg, high above the rooftops of the Baroque historical district. A Magical Theatre and modern media stations add an innovative touch to the experience! Optional evening activity: Salzburg offers daily Mozart concerts, chamber recitals and performances in Mirabell Palace or the Fortress—reservations available on request. Overnight in Salzburg. (B)

DAY 5 SALZBURG – BREGENZ (334km 3h 29m)

Breakfast at the hotel. Today we continue to Bregenz in Austria, a small city on the shores of Lake Constance and famous for its yearly Concerts Festival. It features a large floating stage with a 7,000-seat open-air amphitheatre. The Bregenz Festival is internationally known for its spectacular stage designs that often use the lake itself as part of the performance. Programme for 2026-2027 is La Traviata from Giuseppe Verdi. Upon arrival, check-in at the hotel and free time for private activities. Overnight in Bregenz (B)

DAY 6 BREGENZ – ROTHENBURG (248km 2h 37m)

Breakfast at the hotel. Today we will continue our musical journey north to Germany. Our destination is Rothenburg ob der Tauber, one of the most impressive and well preserved medieval walled-city in Europe. It is part of the Romantic Route, the Germany's oldest and most popular holiday route with nature, culture, art, culinary delights and hospitality. The most interesting part of the old town is the complete wall that can be visited (and used) all the way round. After the check-in at the hotel, we will make a walking tour leaving you enough time to enjoy the wall as well as going shopping. You will find there the most famous Christmas shop in Germany, opened all year round, where you can buy beautiful artcrafts related to Christmas. (B)

DAY 7 ROTHENBURG OB DER TAUBER – FRANKFURT (180km 1h 41m)

Breakfast at the hotel. Today we leave Rothenburg towards Frankfurt am Main. Transfer to your centrally located hotel. Frankfurt's famous opera house, the Alte Oper (Old Opera), opened in 1880, was heavily bombed in 1944, and was meticulously rebuilt, reopening in 1981 as a concert





hall. Oper Frankfurt is considered one of the best opera companies in Europe, offering world-class productions throughout the year. We can secure tickets for any performance upon request. (B)

DAY 8 FRANKFURT AM MAIN – PRAGUE (513km 4h 38m)

Breakfast at the hotel. Today we leave Frankfurt towards the Czech Republic, a pleasant drive with scenic stops along the way. Arrival in Prague, the capital and largest city in the Czech Republic, the 13th largest city in the European Union. Founded during the Romanesque and flourishing by the Gothic, Renaissance and Baroque eras, Prague was the capital of the Kingdom of Bohemia and the main residence of several Holy Roman Emperors, most notably of Charles IV. It was an important city to the Habsburg Monarchy and its Austro-Hungarian Empire. Arrival to the hotel, check-in and free time for private activities. Scroll around the old quarters of the city, the evening lights makes the city very romantic and charming. You have an optional visit to the National Opera for the best opera performance. Overnight. (B)

DAY 9 PRAGUE City Tour and Palais

Breakfast at the hotel. Today we will take part of a city tour in Prague visiting the highlights including the Karl Bridge, the Old Town with the famous astronomical clock, the New Town and the Jewish Quarter. The Estates Theatre, where the premières of Mozart's Don Giovanni and La clemenza di Tito were held is an unforgettable site for music lovers. The possibility to assist to one concert will depend on the program, which we will inform you of in advance. Overnight (B)

DAY 10 PRAGUE – KRAKOW (507km 5h 19m)

Breakfast at the hotel. Today we leave Prague towards Krakow in Poland, the second-largest and one of the oldest cities in Poland, founded in the 7th century. Kraków was the official capital of Poland until 1596 and has traditionally been one of the leading centres of Polish academic, economic, cultural and artistic life. Cited as one of Europe's most beautiful cities, its Old Town was declared the first UNESCO World Heritage Site in the world. Kraków lies in the southern part of Poland. After crossing this territory, we will get to the city and check in at the hotel. Late afternoon, after a short break to relax, we will do a guided tour discovering this fascinating city, including the old town, the Wawel Castle and the Jewish Gettho. After the visit, we will go to a restaurant on the main square for diner where we will try the krakovian and polish specialities like the Bread soup (optional, not included). Krakow also offers classical concerts, Chopin piano recitals and Jewish klezmer music—available as optional evening experiences. Overnight. (B)

DAY 11 KRAKOW – AUSCHWITZ-BIRKENAU - KRAKOW

Breakfast at the hotel. After breakfast we will visit Auschwitz-Birkenau, the concentration and extermination camp during the World War II and the Holocaust controlled by the Nazis. Please note: this is an emotionally heavy visit; comfortable shoes and appropriate clothing are recommended. Two years after the liberation of the camp by the soviet Red Army in January 1945, Auschwitz was converted in one museum and became a dominant symbol of the Holocaust. This is one of the most visited Museums in Poland. Back to Krakow, you will have free time to relax, walk around or going shopping. In the evening, we will suggest you to assist to one musical serenade in one of the prominent theaters in Krakow such as Opera Krakowska, the Juliusz Słowacki Theatre, or chamber music in historic churches. Overnight. (B)

DAY 12 KRAKOW – VIENNA (465km 4h 42m)

Breakfast at the hotel. Transfer to Vienna. Upon arrival, check-in at the hotel and free time for shopping or strolling the old town. As a perfect conclusion to your musical journey, we recommend an optional final-night concert or opera in Vienna—seats available on request. (B)

DAY 13 VIENNA – END OF THE RENDEZVOUS

Breakfast at the hotel. Transfer to the international airport. We hope your Musical Rendezvous through Europe has filled your journey with unforgettable performances, history and beauty. Check-in for your flight back home. End of our services. (B)
