DAY 1 INTERNATIONAL FLIGHT Welcome to Scotland

Departure from your home country to Edinburgh, the capital of Scotland and UNESCO World Heritage Site with the Old Town and New Town. Upon arrival at the airport, our representative will be waiting for you and will welcome you in one of the most beautiful countries in the world. After registration, you will have free time to discover some of the wonders that this city offers you. I comment you that Edinburgh is a great place to shop! Even if the idea of shopping does not seduce you (and if you enjoy it's your lucky day!) you will probably agree that the downtown shopping areas of other cities have no point of comparison with the grandeur of Princes Street and George Street. If you like art, I recommend the National Gallery of Scotland and many other highlights of the city skyline. As night begins, we start to get to know the city in the company of our guide in a tour of ghosts, mysteries, and witches. Since Edinburgh has witnessed throughout its history of bloody events, murders and burnings of witches, the echoes of these events have survived over time and have been permeated in its alleys and cemeteries, which we will visit on this tour. DAY 2 EDINBURGH Castle and Whisky

Breakfast at the hotel. Edinburgh Castle is one of the most exciting historic sites in Western Europe. Set in the heart of Scotland's dynamic capital city, it is sure to capture your imagination. The scenery will take your breath away. The Castle is also one of the oldest fortified places in Europe. With a long rich history as a royal residence, military garrison, prison and fortress, it is alive with many exciting tales. As there is too much to see, we offer you the entrance ticket to enjoy at your own pace this beautiful place. When you climb Castle Hill, you will walk in the footsteps of soldiers, kings and queens – and even the odd pirate or two. Though parts of it remain in military use, the castle is now a world-famous visitor attraction. It's also an iconic part of the Old and New Towns of Edinburgh World Heritage Site. After the visit, return to the hotel or just walk around Edinburgh to discover more interesting places, go shopping or enjoy a coffee or a glass of whisky, the national drink of Scotland. And talking about whisky, even if you are not a whisky fa, the visit to the Johnny Walker Whisky Experience will let you know the importance of this beverage for the Scots and for the world. In about an hour, you will hear and see about whisky and its history. And you can also taste one dram of your favorite one. Return to the hotel to rest. DAY 3 EDINBURGH Loch Ness, Glencoe and the Highlands

Breakfast at the hotel. Today we will take you to some of the most dramatic scenery of the Scottish Highlands. Departing from Edinburgh, we head northwest, passing the imposing Stirling Castle, before making our first stop at in the highlands for some light refreshments. We travel on through Rob Roy Country of Clans MacGregor and Campbell then over the dramatic landscape of Rannoch Moor and the Black Mount to Glencoe, one of Scotland’s most famous glens, site of the 1692 massacre of the Clan MacDonald. Here we pause for a photo stop, and to soak up the atmosphere in this haunting glen. Continuing via Loch Linnhe, we will stop in the Fort William area for lunch then continue into the natural beauty of the Great Glen as we pass beneath Britain’s highest mountain, Ben Nevis. Travelling on, we admire the Caledonian Canal and the pretty village of Fort Augustus, enjoying spectacular views of Loch Ness. Loch Ness, 24 miles long and over 700 feet deep, is most famous for its sightings of the Loch Ness monster, affectionately known as “Nessie”. Spend time at Loch Ness, where you will take a wonderful cruise on the loch. The Loch Ness tour will start its return for home, journeying past Loch Laggan and the woodland scenery of Perthshire, including the Forest of Atholl, with an evening refreshment stop at the Victorian resort town of Pitlochry, en route back to Edinburgh, where the Loch Ness tour ends. Overnight at the Brooks Hotel Edinburgh 3*** or similar **(B)**



DAY 4 EDINBURGH Highland Whisky Experience (9 hours)

Breakfast. Departing Edinburgh, our Ultimate Whisky tour of Scotland begins with a journey north to Dewar's Aberfeldy Distillery for our first whisky themed stop of the day. Dewar's world-renowned crafted Highland Single Malt Aberfeldy whisky has been produced at Aberfeldy Distillery since 1898. We spend 2 hours here for their Whisky and Chocolate tasting tour at £19.55 per person (to be paid directly there); comprising of a full guided tour of the distillery, warehouse and interactive heritage exhibition, and a tasting of Aberfeldy's 12 year old single malt whisky. After a Dewar's Aberfeldy Distillery tour, we continue to the village of Aberfeldy for lunch. Spend time here exploring its streets, enjoy the scenery with plenty of time to grab a bite to eat before our whisky tour continues to Loch Lubnaig, and then to Glenturret Distillery. Located on the Turret River, just outside of Crieff, Glenturret Distillery is Scotland's oldest working distillery. Here, we enjoy a tour and tasting at £15 (to be paid at the distillery). Our final stop of the day is a short photo break at Doune Castle (famous for its appearances in Outlander, Game of Thrones and Outlaw King) before we return to Edinburgh where our Ultimate Whisky tour ends. Overnight at the Brooks Hotel Edinburgh 3*** or similar. **(B)**



DAY 5 HIGHLANDS Isle of Skye

Breakfast. We starts in Edinburgh and head west to the picturesque conservation village of Luss, on the ‘Bonny, Bonny’ banks of Loch Lomond. Travelling north via Tyndrum we pass over the Rannoch Moor before enjoying time to admire the dramatic Glencoe valley, site of the 1692 massacre of the MacDonald Clan. After lunch in the Fort William area, we will pause for photos at Britain’s highest mountain, Ben Nevis, then stop to admire Glen Garry and the stunning Five Sisters of Kintail mountain range. Our journey ends in the charming village of Portree, on the Isle of Skye for the Overnight **(B)**



DAY 6 HIGHLANDS Duntulm Castle, Kilt Rock and Old Man Storr

After breakfast we will depart Portree for a full day’s touring - options include Dunvegan Castle, or a trip to Uig and a stop to visit Flora MacDonald’s grave and the unique Black Houses, ancient dwellings of the Scottish Highlanders. We continue our journey where we can view Duntulm Castle, take photos of Kilt Rock and perhaps enjoy a walk at the Lealt Falls. Our day will end with the opportunity to admire the Old Man of Storr, before we return to Portree for the overnight **(B)**



DAY 7 HIGHLANDS Castle of Eilean Donan and Pitlochry

Breakfast at the hotel. We commence our descent via the much-admired Eilean Donan Castle, backdrop for the movie, ‘Highlander’; then move on to the pretty loch-side village of Fort Augustus for lunch and views of Loch Ness. Our tour continues south over Laggan and the Grampian mountains with our last stop, for refreshments, in the Victorian resort town of Pitlochry, before returning to Edinburgh, where our tour terminates. Overnight at the Brooks Hotel Edinburgh 3*** or similar. **(B)**



DAY 8 EDIMBURG Return flight

Breakfast at the hotel. You will be able to enjoy the city and do your last purchases before departure at the agreed time towards the airport in Edinburgh for your return flight or connection to your next destination in Europe. End of our services. **(B)**
